

Outcome Variables: Measuring Effects of Interventions

Gold standard = crime statistics

- Difficult to have control experiments
- Takes time to accumulate
 - Individual events are more rare

Surrogate measures: Tendencies

- Surveys
 - Emotions
- Films
 - Subconscious behaviours

Method: Filmed Scans

Strengths

- Not as invasive as questionnaires
- Larger N numbers

Weaknesses

- May be selective
- Subjective bias of experimenter

- Relationships
 - Especially self-affirmation
 - Territorial Gestures
- Distance & Touching
- Tempo
- Hand Positions and Gestures

Social Territory: A Cognitive Behavioural Construct

- A need or drive
- Trigger cues or contexts
 - Triggers from the environment that initiate or amplify awareness of the drive
- A set of Driven Behaviours
 - Directed toward satisfying the drive
- Achievement signals from the environment that territory has been achieved
- Rewarding Cognitive states and emotions
 - In response to achieving territory

Social Territory: Back Touching

• Leadership in conflict

Example of Territory Construct: Leadership Conflict

Drive	Alpha female needs to feel in charge of territory
Trigger cue	Has her leadership challenged
Driven behaviour	Back touches challenger
Achievement signal	Woman in blue accepts "being guided" by back touch
Rewarding outcome emotion	Alpha female feels empowered and rapidly rushes back into the lead


Aggression & Territory

- Showing ownership or possession
 - Grabbing, pulling, pushing
 - Especially another person
 - Showing off
 - Rude finger gestures
- Closed queuing
- Friendly & open
 - Waving
 - Open queuing


Film: Territory: Look At Me

Interacting with the Camera




Queuing: Open or closed

Future Experiments

- Higher N numbers
 - Especially for non-music condition
- Stationary cameras also
 - To test for experimenter bias
- Problem:
 - The choice of music makes a difference
